FOOP Works to Reforest the ENTIRE Oakhurst Neighborhood

2023 was filled with tons of great **FOOP** projects benefitting not only Oakhurst Park, but the entire Oakhurst Neighborhood!

Not only did FOOP sponsor it's annual "Spruce Up Oakhurst Park" where neighbors join together to spiffy up the park for the upcoming summer months, but on that same day in in March, FOOP also sponsored the "Reforest Oakhurst Neighborhood Project".

While similar to the "2019 Reforest Oakhurst Park Project", this year's

project, "Reforest Oakhurst Neighborhood" was aimed at reforesting the <u>ENTIRE</u> Oakhurst neighborhood —not just Oakhurst Park. During "Reforest Oakhurst Park", 10 native Oak Trees were planted in specific areas designated by Fort Worth City Forester Craig Fox. During the "Reforest Oakhurst Neighborhood" project, Oakhurst residents claimed 3 trees of various varieties for planting at their individual homes.

Oakhurst neighbor Brad Roberts and FOOP Vice President Johnathan Zimmerer kindly delivered the trees and dug holes for those

residents who needed help while FOOP President Sharon Kutilek Buse kept up with the paper work.

Each resident was tasked with planting their trees within view of the street. The City of Fort Worth will monitor the trees for two years for growth and survivability. The tree planting program is citywide and a successful outcome will result in the City of Fort Worth receiving future grants for more trees to plant to reforest <u>all</u> Fort Worth neighborhoods!

In total, 68 Oakhurst residents participated in the "2023 Reforest Oakhurst Neighborhood" tree planting project and over 123 trees were planted in Oakhurst yards.

The goal of both the "Reforest Oakhurst Park" and the "Reforest Oakhurst Neighborhood" project is to replace our neighborhood's decayed & dying trees so generations to come can experience the beauty of a tree filled park & neighborhood as we know it today.



DID YOU KNOW... the City of Fort Worth does not irrigate neighborhood parks and only mows them once every 21 days? This was not always the case, in fact, for many years the City absorbed all the irrigation costs and maintenance, then...the no irrigation policy for neighborhood parks was adopted. Fortunately for Oakhurst Park, upon the policy's adoption, the City, through oversight or kindness continued to irrigate Oakhurst Park until 2015. At that time, the irrigation controllers broke, and the entire irrigation system failed causing the grass and most of the vegetation to die, including many trees.

In the fall of 2015, the Kutilek Buse family adopted Oakhurst Park and **Friends of Oakhurst Park-FOOP**, was founded on October 14, 2015, with the sole purpose of caring for Oakhurst Park! With its high standards and impeccable record, just 2 years and 1 month later, **FOOP** received it's 501(c)3 IRS designated non-profit status!!!

As a 501(c)3 service organization the FOOP Board oversees the park and the Buse Family maintains the park. The park is spiffed up prior to all ONA neighborhood social events, meeting votes, and other neighborhood activities. In the 9 years since FOOP's founding in 2015, tens of thousands of dollars have been spent by a private donor improving and maintaining Oakhurst Park including grass replaced, crepe Myrtles purchased, irrigation lines run, annual seasonal flowers planted, irrigation run to newly planted trees and added to the park sign planting bed, parts purchased, equipment rented, weekly/bi-weekly maintenance & constant repair to the 50+ year old irrigation system. FOOP has successfully partnered with the City to install ADA/pet friendly drinking fountains & sidewalks and to secured new playground equipment installed in Spring of 2023 and as well as completed so many additional projects for the benefit of Oakhurst park they are too numerous to list!
